These members are defined as individuals with a huge experience and knowledge in their field such as: doctors, lawyers, etc. who on the free bursary and when required in the field advice the charity on some issues in their field of expertise. These members are also often asked to come along to ASYABI events to share their expertise. Sometimes a fee can be applied for such requests by the ASYABI. Mostly they advise with no charge ASYABI. They are not required to take part to all meetings hosted by the Trustees Board of ASYABI. However, they must take part to AGMs and have the right to vote or to nominate themselves as all members.

About us

Founded in Leeds in the United Kingdom in June 2008, ASYABI became a registered charity in July 2012. It is led by volunteers and people affected by Sickle Cell Anaemia and Thalassaemia aiming to provide self-support and information, advice and other helps needed to people and their families affected by sickle cell and thalassaemia.



Supporting

ASYABI is currently seeking funds from Grants Scheme including fundraising activities to launch by 2015 a long run project titled '**Reaching Marginal Community with Sickle Cell and Thalassaemia in the Yorkshire and in the UK for a change of Perception**'. There are 95 patients (adults) who live with sickle cell in Leeds. According to our research on the ground, most of these patients suffer from social exclusion, isolation, even when they are hospitalized at St. James Hospital for sickle cell crisis (pain in the bones). They are totally isolated without any social support because of the lack of a self-help patient group like ASYABI which takes into account all these aspects and as patients; we can understand their feelings and needs. This painful and chronic genetic condition that thousands of children and adults like us suffer in the UK lead most of us to feel different from other children and as a result of this huge stigma associated to social exclusion 'across the UK despite the fact there are more than 14,000 of sufferers but less than 300 of patients take part to social events, conferences and seminars on their own condition'. In Leeds, 3 patients out of 40 came to public events because they do not want to present themselves as sufferers. Our work is aiming to help them for a change of perception and self-believe through this proposal. Support and advice is provided by telephone, email and will be expanded through home visits. This proposal from time to time will have a nationwide impact to strength Patient Groups initiatives.

Campaigning

Since 2009, our self-help patient group also known as "ASYABI", has been able to provide conferences, leaflets, etc. on this issue to raise awareness of sickle cell disorder in Leeds and Yorkshire. These events are often attended by other representatives of Charities in the field and other patients across the UK.

Mission Statement

The Association of Sickle Cell sufferers of Yorkshire for Africa and Basic Information (ASYABI) was founded in Leeds in the United Kingdom in June 2008. It is a registered charity led by volunteers and people affected by Sickle Cell Anaemia and Thalassaemia aiming to provide self-support and information, advice and other helps needed to people and their families affected by sickle cell and thalassaemia.

Our Objectives

ASYABI seeks to **promote awareness** and **understanding** of **this painful genetic condition known as Sickle Cell** through a wide range of activities including: -

- To promote the relief of people suffering from sickle cell and thalassaemia disorders.
- To advance education of the public in order to increase knowledge and understanding of sickle cell and thalassaemia disorders.
- To promote research into the nature, prevalence treatment and the prevention of sickle cell and thalassaemia disorders and disseminate and publish the useful results thereof.

Therefore, the current Chair of ASYABI will step down at the next AGM planned to be called in May 2015. During the past six and half years, his huge experience and determination both as a sufferer of sickle cell and the chairperson has led ASYABI to become a Registered Charity. Based on his experience and capacity; he has been appointed to take over the role of Project Manager for the next coming years. This role is also defined as a Chief Executive or Executive Director.
